	All work must be carried out to comply with workplace procedures, according to state/territory health and safety, food safety, biosecurity and environmental regulations, legislation and standards that apply to the workplace. Licences may be required if operating load-shifting equipment, vehicles or vessels.
	No occupational licensing, legislative or certification requirements apply to this unit at the time of publication.

### **Performance Evidence**

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all the elements and performance criteria of this unit. There must be evidence that the individual has conducted stock feeding activities for aquaculture on at least one occasion including:

- communicating with supervisor on feeding activities
- · collecting and loading the correct quantity of feed
- using correct feeding techniques for stock
- operating basic feeding equipment
- maintaining and undertaking basic repairs to feeding equipment
- completing feed related data materials
- cleaning up work area checking repair requirements and storing tools and equipment
- following health and safety and environmental requirements.

## **Knowledge Evidence**

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- basic characteristics of normal and abnormal stock feeding behaviour
- effects of water and atmospheric conditions on stock feeding behaviour
- feeding equipment types, handling requirements, calibration and operating methods
- storage requirements to maintain quality of feed
- types and quantities of feed required for workplace stock
- relevant legislation relating to stock feeding for aguaculture

#### **Assessment Conditions**

Assessment of this unit of competency must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
  - skills must be demonstrated in an aquaculture workplace setting or an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- resources, equipment and materials:
  - feeding equipment appropriate for stock and workplace
  - personal protective equipment
  - stock to feed
  - · feed for stock
  - data or recording sheets
- specifications:
  - work order or specific instructions and workplace procedures for feeding stock
  - manufacturer instructions for equipment handling, calibration and operation
- relationships:
  - interactions with supervisor
