Qualification Description

In this role, these individuals have responsibility for ensuring that compliance monitoring and administrative procedures comply with legislative and jurisdictional requirements. They plan and promote fisheries management awareness programs for commercial, recreational and traditional fishers and may undertake surveillance and observer operations as part of their role.

All work is carried out to comply with workplace procedures, according to state/territory health and safety, food safety, biosecurity and environmental regulations, legislation and standards that apply to the workplace.

Legislative requirements apply to this qualification and may vary across states and territories. Users are required to check with the relevant jurisdiction for current requirements.

Entry Requirements

There are no entry requirements for this qualification.

To achieve this qualification, competency must be demonstrated in:

- 12 units of competency:
 - 6 core units plus
