To keep up with the domestic and international demand for Australian wines, the operations of large-scale wineries is becoming increasingly sophisticated.

Those with expertise in wine operations are invited to provide feedback on current work practices and skills, so they can be captured in nationally endorsed units of competency.

Why is this project happening?

Automation is changing the way work is done, with more complex equipment and systems now standard practice. Leading hands also require the skills to coordinate and lead the numerous temporary and casual workers that supplement this workforce during harvest and vintage.

These advanced skills are being embedded in the Certificate III in Wine Industry Operations, which is being reviewed in consultation with wine industry experts.

The Food, Beverage and Pharmaceutical Industry Reference Committee is overseeing this project, as part of their responsibility to support engagement with the sector, and to ensure the project meets industry stakeholder needs.
