Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has:

 walked at least three individual dogs on lead according to individual dog requirements and environmental conditions.

In doing the above, the individual must have:

- · obtained client information and dog history for each dog
- positively reinforced appropriate behaviour for each dog
- handled each animal in a safe and humane manner using appropriate equipment
- maintained a workplace log and records.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- · key requirements of local animal management regulations relating to dogs in the community
- insurance requirements relating to dog walking activities
- methods for identifying dogs
- methods for obtaining background information including medical conditions, health/vaccination status and behavioural issues
- physical features and exercise needs of common dog breeds
- basic animal anatomy and physiology relevant to dog exercise and restraint
- safe and humane dog handling and restraint techniques and procedures
- behavioural characteristics of common dog breeds, including:
 - how to recognise body language and emotional states
 - signs of undesirable or maladaptive behaviours
- humane behaviour management techniques, including positive reinforcement
- hazards and risks relevant to walking activities, including:
 - cars/traffic
 - other dogs, people, wildlife
 - toxic substances pesticides and poisons
 - personal injuries bites, scratches
- · workplace policies, procedures and requirements, including:
 - safety and emergency procedures
 - hygiene and infection control
 - waste disposal
 - animal welfare and humane handling
- safe use of disinfectants and cleaning agents
- · requirements of relevant record keeping system.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment of skills must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
 - skills must be demonstrated in a workplace setting or an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- · resources, equipment and materials:
 - · live dogs for walking and exercising specified in the performance evidence
 - equipment for walking and exercising dogs
- specifications:
 - access to local animal management regulations relating to dogs in the community.
