## **Performance Evidence**

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this

There must be evidence that the individual has:

- safely assessed and documented the suitability of at least two performance horses for a particular purpose, including for each horse:
  - researched and evaluated pedigree information and the possibility of common equine genetic disorders
  - evaluated conformation
- purchased at least one horse, including:
- · researched current market conditions relevant to horse breed, class or sport
- prepared a list of potential horses for purchase that meet desired goals
- organised registration, insurance and transportation of a horse on purchase
- prepared and implement an education or re-education program

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- performance horse breeds and breed standards
- breed society regulations and registration procedures
- horse traits and conformation suited to various horse sports
- sport horse association and society regulations and registration procedures
- principles of genetic inheritance including Mendelian laws relating to dominance, segregation and independent assortment
- cytogenetics in relation to common inherited diseases and disorders of horses
- situations and requirements relating DNA testing of parentage and genetic disorders
- equine pedigrees and performance of sires and dams in individual horse pedigrees
- · sources of current information about breed or sport of horses under consideration for purchase
- types of equine insurance
- suitable methods for transporting horses
- key requirements of relevant legislation and codes of practice, including:
  - · biosecurity and transportation of horses
  - · workplace health and safety relating to interactions with horses
  - animal welfare relating to the safe, humane and ethical care of horses.
