<b>Performance Evidence</b>	
<p>An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.</p> <p>There must be evidence that the individual has performed specialist amenity pruning on at least three different plants including at least one tree using at least three of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• secateurs</li> <li>• loppers or extension loppers</li> <li>• shears</li> <li>• pruning or pole saws</li> <li>• powered hedgers</li> <li>• powered secateurs</li> </ul> <p>and has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• applied workplace health and safety requirements</li> <li>• selected, used and maintained tools, equipment and machinery required for specialist amenity pruning</li> <li>• identified and inspected plants</li> <li>• met pruning program requirements</li> <li>• carried out pruning using specialist pruning techniques</li> <li>• applied site environmental and disease control procedures</li> <li>• stored and carried tools safely</li> <li>• assessed pruning quality</li> <li>• cleaned and cleared pruning site</li> <li>• reported unserviceable tools, equipment and machinery</li> <li>• reported work outcomes.</li> </ul>	
<b>Knowledge Evidence</b>	
<p>An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• workplace requirements applicable to health and safety in the workplace for performing specialist amenity pruning, including appropriate use of personal protective equipment (PPE)</li> <li>• principles and practices of specialist amenity pruning, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• anatomy and physiology of plants, shrubs and trees</li> <li>• AS4373-2007 Pruning of amenity trees</li> <li>• compartmentalisation of decay in trees (CODIT)</li> <li>• effect on plant growth and habit after pruning</li> <li>• identification of plant species and their pruning requirements</li> <li>• local government tree protection and preservation regulations</li> <li>• types of plants and their pruning requirements, including; climbing plants, fruiting plants, standard plants</li> <li>• methods of specialist pruning, including; espalier, topiary, hedging, pleaching, crown lifting, pollarding, thinning out and sucker control</li> <li>• specialist pruning tools, equipment and machinery</li> </ul> </li> <li>• site environmental and disease control procedures applicable to performing specialist amenity pruning.</li> </ul>
