<b>Performance Evidence</b>	
<p>An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.</p> <p>There must be evidence that the individual has identified and selected animals for breeding on at least one occasion and has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• documented a breeding program</li> <li>• developed selection criteria for a breeding program</li> <li>• identified animals that have defects in conformation or inadequate productivity</li> <li>• selected animals that display characteristics associated with desirable genetic traits</li> <li>• selected animals according to breeding program selection criteria</li> <li>• assessed and recorded performance information.</li> </ul>	
<b>Knowledge Evidence</b>	
<p>An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• principles and practices for identifying and selecting animals for breeding, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• genetic selection for targeted multi traits</li> <li>• structural abnormalities and their potential impact on production</li> <li>• market requirements and related physical and measurable traits</li> <li>• workplace animal selection criteria</li> <li>• strategies for animal selection, including individual traits, measured performance, relevant breeding values, and indexes</li> </ul> </li> <li>• use of breeding value percentile tables.</li> </ul>
