Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

- observed safety during work operations
- followed workplace procedures for dealing with accidents, fire and emergencies within the scope of responsibilities
- fitted and used personal protective equipment (PPE) relevant to area of work
- machinery and equipment operator manuals relevant to area of work
- read and followed workplace notices and workplace safety signs, symbols, labels and work instructions
- participated in arrangements for maintaining the workplace health and safety of all people in the workplace
- · recorded information accurately or verbally reporting information.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- workplace health and safety legislation, regulations, codes of practice and workplace procedures relevant to area of work
- employee and employer workplace health and safety responsibilities

- · hazards and risks in the industry sector.
