- · identified plants, animals and resources used for medicine and food in a local area
- · provided information on cultural practices in accordance with local cultural protocols
- collected plant and animal samples using appropriate equipment according to organisational requirements
- applied environmentally sustainable work practices when working on Country
- used common and Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander names for plants and animals
- · applied work health and safety practices in the context of own work.

## Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- local Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander guidelines and/or protocols that may include:
  - · use of images and voices
  - · acknowledgement and respect for cultural identity, practices and beliefs
  - openness and transparency in communication
  - asking permissions
- methods for documenting observations
- minimising disruption or degradation to an area may include:
  - not removing or disturbing plant material
  - disposing of all waste or litter
  - · walking or driving on designated tracks and pathways
- equipment may include:
  - · digital recording equipment
  - computers or laptops
  - smart phones
  - · cameras and video equipment
  - safety equipment required for observation activities including personal protective equipment
- instruction manuals for operating equipment
- plant and animal uses and significance relating to a local Community, group or region
- common and Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander names for plants and animals significant to the local Community
- cultural protocols relevant to region, local Community and groups
- role and rights of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples in maintaining and controlling cultural practices
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander peoples' protocols for identifying individuals who are authorised to share information in relation to cultural practices
- · intellectual and cultural property rights
- free, prior, and informed consent in decision making processes
- the basic requirements for ensuring the welfare of animals described in the relevant Codes of Practice.

## **Assessment Conditions**
